### Collective Worship

He has taken small groups of children out for Maths, developed an Eco Team and been teaching PE in Y2 and Y5 once a week. On Tuesday, ten of our Y5/6 children attended a football festival at Bodymoor Heath, which is where AVFC train! They did us so proud as their conduct and sportsmanship was commented on by the coaches. And we saw amazing displays of talent and teamwork amongst our children!

### School Developments

This week Y1 have completed their Phonics Screening Check and Y4 have been completing their Multiplication Tables Check. The results of these assessments will be shared with you in the children's end of year report.

We also had a visit from Birmingham School Services to moderate our Y2 assessments. Miss Goodwin and Mrs Pickup spent the morning discussing the children's work and checking the children have securely demonstrated they have learnt the necessary skills. It was a positive, productive morning that confirmed our judgements.

Mrs Wilson visited St Catherine of Siena to observe their Collective Worship and steal some fantastic ideas from them! Thank you to Mr Fadden, Mr Minchin and pupils for being so welcoming.

### **Nursery Places**



#### Sacramental preparation

It is so important that children are prepared for these significant events in their life. The teaching that goes on in school is only part of what the children need in preparation for making their First Confession, First Holy Communion and Confirmation – there is an expectation that parents/carers take children to Mass every week to further prepare them. Remember to take Mass attendance cards with you to have them signed at the end of Mass.

#### <u>Safety</u>

#### Parking

Please make sure that if you are dropping off or collecting your children from school that you do not park or stop on the yellow zig-zag lines outside either of the school entrances. They are there to make sure that the pavements are clear for people wishing to cross the road. Parking or stopping in these zones puts the children in danger. Please help us to keep all the children safe.

#### **Play Equipment**

Please don't let your children play on the trim trail or go onto the grass in the mornings or after school please. This is to keep everyone safe before and after school.

#### Scooters and Bikes

Please make sure that all children walk their bikes or scooters in the school grounds. They can ride and scoot as soon as they have left the school gates.

Thank you for your support in keeping everyone safe on our site.

### Absence reporting procedures

#### If your child is going to be absent please call school on each day of your child's absence by 9am.

Please call 0121 454 0600 and leave a message on the absence line. Include your child's full name, class and reason for absence. Please tell us where possible the nature of the illness as 'sick' or 'unwell' does not outline the reason for the absence. This will ensure that we have an accurate attendance record for your child. If no reason is given it will be an unauthorised absence.

Please ensure that your children are on time for school. School doors open at 8.40am (8:30 Y6) when the children come into school for a prompt start to their learning which begins at 8.50am. At 8.50am we expect all children to be seated in class ready to commence their learning as this is when lessons will start promptly. Some children are consistently arriving after the school gates are shut and this is impacting on their well-being and leading to lost learning time.

#### A big thank you to the majority of parents and carers who make sure their children attend school regularly!

#### **Attendance Monitoring**

If your child's attendance has fallen below 95%, or they have a number of unauthorised absences we will be in contact with you, and depending on the reason for their absence we may ask you to come to school for a meeting.

If you have received an attendance letter and would like to come into school to meet with Mrs Wilson to discuss it, please make an appointment at the school office.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Family holidays in term time are not allowed in law and are unlikely to be authorised. Family emergencies also need careful consideration. It is not always appropriate or in the best interests of the child to miss school for emergencies which are being dealt with by adult family members. Notifying the school of leave due to a family emergency **does not mean it will be authorised.** Any notifications must be made in writing and addressed to the Headteacher (communication@oratory.bham.sch.uk can be used).

Children in Y5/6 may also bring a small towel and roll-on deodorant on their PE day.

Please ensure children come to school in the correct PE kit. It is important that they are wearing suitable clothing and footwear for physical activity and that the kit is in line with school expectations. Speak with your child's class teacher if there are any problems with this. Reminders will be sent out to parents of children who do not have the correct kit.
